- 1. The most important thing before he died is to make sure they take part in his death
- 2. Nobody (other than John) were there in presence
- 3. John 6:54 Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life

(slide 7) Through baptism into death with Jesus we enter the new covenant

Rom 6:4 We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life.

- 1. We need to take part in Jesus' death to be in covenant
- 2. The covenant of Abraham
 - i. God paid the price
 - ii. We take part

(slide 8) Jesus bore the blunt of God's judgment for our sins on the cross
